- If the grain for sheaves is cut from a field not grown by exhibitor, **permission must be asked and grower acknowledged** on the entry tag.

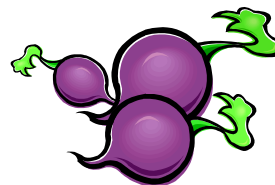
