### ➤ REGULATIONS

- Sheaves to be no less than 4" in diameter at the middle band
- Sheaves should be tied in three places, butts neatly trimmed
- Entries not meeting requirements will be disqualified
- 2007 crop forage judged on feed value, with leafiness emphasized
- If the grain for sheaves is cut from a field not grown by exhibitor, permission must be asked and grower acknowledged on the entry tag
- Sheaves must however be made by exhibitor
